



The Center for Latin American, Caribbean, and Latino Studies (CLACLS) at The Graduate Center, City University of New York announces that applications are open for the *Miranda Family Fellowship for the Study of Puerto Rican Migration to and Communities in the United States*.

This fellowship, generously funded by the Miranda Family, will provide the successful candidate with full tuition payment and a \$25,000 annual stipend for five years. The fellow will pursue a Ph.D. in History.

Luis A. Miranda, Jr., founding partner of the MirRam Group, LLC., has been an active supporter of the Center for Latin American, Caribbean and Latino Studies as chair of its board of directors since 2001, when the center was established.

The successful fellowship candidate must fulfill all of the criteria for admittance to the Ph.D. Program in History at the Graduate Center. After choosing a specialization in either United States or Latin American and Caribbean history, the Fellow will conduct research for a doctoral dissertation on Puerto Rican migration and the development of Puerto Rican communities in the U.S. All requirements for a Ph.D. in History must be fulfilled prior to awarding the degree.

The candidate will be mentored as an intern at the Center for Latin American, Caribbean, and Latino Studies.

The application deadline is February 1, 2018.
